COLD & FLU PRECAUTIONS

Our response to cold and flu should continue to be guided by recommendations from our health officials. During 'flu seasons', they are recommending extra caution which includes:

- ◆ Those who are feeling ill stay at home so as not to spread the disease;
- ◆ Increased vigilance in washing hands and not touching our own eyes, mouth, or nose;
- ◆ Coughing and sneezing into disposable tissues (and washing one's hands afterwards), or if none available, the inside of one's forearm to reduce spreading any virus;
- ◆ Getting the current flu and pneumonia vaccination;

Whenever there is a report of a disease outbreak, it is often asked if we would stop the shaking of hands at the Sign of Peace. However, that 'solution' ignores the fact that colds and flu are also airborne viruses. Those who are infected can spread such viruses simply through breathing, let alone sneezing and coughing. Also, if someone's hands are infected, then those hands also touch door handles, tops of pew, hymnals, etc... and spread the virus to those surfaces. If the touch of hands is to be excluded at the Sign of Peace to avoid 'contact germs,' then one would also have to refrain from touching *anything* in the church that those infected hands have also touched, which is nearly impossible to do. The absolutely best way for colds and flu to be kept from spreading is for those who have them to self-quarantine.

REGISTRATION/CENSUS

Do you consider Mary, Mother of Jesus Parish "home"? Do you worship with us regularly? If you have not done so already, we ask that you please register in our parish. Forms for this purpose are available in the church or online at www.mmjchurch.org. Adult children no longer living at home and recently married couples are especially encouraged to register. In this way we can serve you better. It also facilitates sponsorship for baptisms and confirmations, religious education registration, etc.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This sacrament should no longer be considered exclusively for the dying, as in "last rites". It is to be celebrated by and for those whose health has been seriously impaired by illness or old age. Anyone may be anointed before surgery or an invasive test or medical procedure. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious. This is one more way that God imparts to each of us, and in particular at this time to the seriously ill and elderly his endless love and grace. Please contact Fr. FROM VERY REV. PETER FAULK, JCL, JV

For the edification of our entire Diocesan family, here are posted the norms for the election of the incoming Diocesan Administrator. It is in a spirit of prayer and holiness that the College of Consultors will gather to cast their votes before the eyes of God and His people. The Diocesan Administrator will be bound by canon law to serve the Diocese in continuity of the spirit and intention of the outgoing Bishop as well as to prepare the way for the arrival and ministry of a new Shepherd.

1. The college of consultors has eight (8) days to elect a Diocesan Administrator after Bishop Talley has taken possession of the See of Memphis on April 2, 2019 (c. 421).
2. On the day of meeting, the consultors gather. A simple majority (at least half) of those eligible to vote must be present for the election (c. 119).
3. The senior consultor (by age) chairs the meeting.
4. The senior consultor opens the meeting with a prayer.
5. The consultors then select someone to serve as notary.
6. The consultors then select two tellers (*scrutator*) who will collect and count the votes (c. 173).
7. The floor is subsequently opened for nominations and discussion. The candidates must be priests or bishops who have completed thirty-five (35) years of age; they must be outstanding in doctrine and prudence, they cannot have already been elected, appointed, or presented for the same vacant Diocese. Priest candidates may be from the local presbytery or from elsewhere; bishop candidates may be the bishop emeritus, or even a Diocesan or an auxiliary bishop from another Diocese (c. 425).
8. When the nomination and discussion is completed, the consultors vote.
9. Voting must occur by secret ballot. Each consultor casts one vote for one candidate (c. 172).
10. The two (2) tellers (*scrutator*) collect and count the votes in the presence of the senior consultor. The tellers together open the votes and announce for whom each vote was cast. The notary records how many votes each person received. If one candidate receives at least two-thirds of the votes cast, the candidate is elected as Diocesan Administrator. (*Directory for the Pastoral Ministry of Bishops*, n. 238).
11. The notary inscribes the results of the election whereupon the notary, the two (2) tellers and the chairman sign the record. The record is to be kept in the Diocesan archive.

THE FRIDAYS OF LENT

Good Friday and all the Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The obligation to abstain from meat binds Catholics 14 years of age and older. The obligation to fast on Good Friday, limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of the day, binds Catholics from the age of 18 to 59. Those who are younger or older may freely embrace these disciplines. But Lenten disciplines should never endanger your health. It is obvious that abstaining from meat is meaningless for vegetarians, who must choose some other form of abstinence. It is equally obvious that replacing meat with a gourmet seafood meal is not in keeping with the spirit of Lent.
